

HELP AND ADVICE TO DISABLED PEOPLE IN DERBY

Disability Charity Leonard Cheshire and Derby Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) are embarking on a new joint venture to develop an advice service for people with disabilities in the city.

The new Leonard Cheshire Disability Advisor will be based at the Citizens Advice Bureau on Sitwell Street, Derby, and will provide a generalist advice service to people with disabilities in Derby. The Citizens Advice service provides free confidential and independent advice on a range of issues.

There are also plans to develop a number of community advice clinics to ensure that disabled people can access the necessary support and advice when and where they need it most. One of these is the CVS where people with disabilities can access the service. This is due to commence on the 17th April and every Tuesday thereafter.
